- I. Online program being developed out of Arts & Sciences in Environmental Sciences (Coyne) a. Don't think this is a direct conflict to adding a track in IPSS
- II. Symposium (Unrine)
  - a. Students had the opportunity to sign-up for Fall or Spring online
  - b. Mandatory presentations for 2<sup>nd</sup> year and above
  - c. Should symposium be moved to once/year before field season? Or pre-Fall term?
    - i. Everyone would present poster or seminar-style
    - ii. Before Spring term
    - iii. Think about this as a possibility
    - iv. Committee of grad students to organize
  - d. PLS 772 Seminar what does that mean?
    - i. Used for internal/external speakers
      - ii. Students help organize symposium; present; presentation grade is course grade
        1. Extension agents credit by exam
    - iii. Does this stay as a requirement?
      - 1. No such requirement in new STO program
      - 2. Make description & requirements clear
    - iv. Present at symposium and organize
      - 1. How does this work if symposium dates change?
      - 2. How long can an "I" grade be carried?
    - v. Geosciences moved to seminar attendance and proposal development in a communicating science course
    - vi. Coyne will draft syllabus of 772 to clarify objectives; the course will stay on the books as is
      - 1. Must be taken within first 2 semesters
    - vii. When is this the most valuable to students?
      - 1. Katherine believes the second year because students have seen everything
- III. Admissions and Enrollments
  - a. Accepted 14; 7 enrolled for 2018-2019
    - i. Low selectivity, high yield is the goal from the Graduate School
    - ii. IPSS looks the reverse because we accept only those with a home/faculty advisor
  - b. 50-50 domestic-international; high female; slightly more PhD than MS
  - c. Do we change the standards?
    - i. GRE tied to fellowships (75<sup>th</sup>/50<sup>th</sup> percentile) and a minimum GPA
    - ii. If pre-selection is already happening, no reason to change standards
    - iii. Reach more students through recruitment rather than raise standards
    - iv. Competitive with peer institutions on stipends
    - v. Improve online presence and word of mouth
      - 1. How to promote openings outside UK
- IV. Courses
  - a. 400G courses originated from BCTC
    - i. Must be taken outside discipline area to count toward degree
    - ii. Change these courses to 500-level
      - 1. Wetland Delineation (who will teach? Elisa? Barton?)
      - 2. Biogeochemistry 600-level?

- 3. Soil Nutrient 500-level
- b. On-demand course offerings which courses should be converted?
- c. EES uses special topics for courses
  - i. 2/3 MS; 20-25 in classes; 35 total students in the EES program
- d. Floating 697 courses with topics
- e. Defining courses in concentrations
  - i. Helps with recruitment
- f. What courses are standard for disciplinary area?
  - i. Stats course is needed specific to IPSS
  - ii. Disciplinary area leads on courses: Coyne soils; Downie hort; Pfeiffer crop; Hunt – plant bio; Unrine - environmental
